Approach and Methods

Quantitative Enquiry (Status Quo-Analysis)

	forwarded	response
Ministries	16	7
Forest administration/ Services	20	9
Institutions of FREE	145	51

FREE = Forest Related Environmantal Education



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Approach and Methods

Qualitative Enquiry

Interviews with experts (37)

Telephone interview with participants of the certificate training (15)

Personal questionnaire to ascertain the professional stages and courses of education Participating monitoring (12) Internet research (content analysis)







The "Hidden Agenda"



- Models of social change
 - Adolescents are passive technique consumer
 - No direct Nature contact
- Lack of "Nature knowledge"
- Estrangement of Nature Neglection, Ignoration





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Gender sensitive education



- Identification of structural differences,
- Reflection on gender different learning approaches and interests in topics,
- Integration of gender aspects in target-group oriented communication.





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Male orientation:

- Competitive behaviour,
- Spatial expansion,
- Technical orientation
- self confidence and willingness for risks,
- awareness of the own body strength
- Prefer competitive games
 - Prefer sportive body related actions
- Attraction to facts and technical aspects about nature and environmental problems



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Female orientation:

- Solidarity with others as a principle,
- Cooperative behaviour,
- Home oriented use of space,
- Integration of technique to the social context
 - Selfcontrol and deficiency as a body awareness concept.

→ Prefer context or solution oriented knowledge about nature





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The professionals



Objectives of FREE

- Knowledge about the sylvan ecosystem
- 2. Change in awareness and behaviour towards environmental matters
- 3. Sustainable use of resources
- 4. Public relation for forestry
- 5. "Social work"







Gender



Gender aspects are only considered rudimentally and only of a few, although the importance and impact is seen of nearly 50% of the interviewed persons.
Obviously there is a lack of basical knowledge for an alternative offer that considers gender aspects.



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Professional aspects of FREE

FREE is a part time business but not a domain of women
The majority of well paid positions is covered by men
Most of the freelancers or volunteers are women
71% of the personal has a silvicultural qualifiction (80% are men)

More than 50% of the women has a pedagogic qualification.







Conclusion



Indefinite: aims and concept of education: What should FREE contribute for? Communication of facts about nature? Obligate part of the school education? Nature and body experience? Education for a sustainable development? Social therapy?

Little appearance: Cooperation with "social" caring institutions and with economical orientated organisations, like e.g. touristic enterprises or wood-working industry.

Some topics are underrepresented: Global aspects, forest as working places, the interconnexion of ecological, economical and social aspects of forest management,

Unclear: Which new skills are needed ?

Missing: No effective and supportive control of quality exists.
